

# Grissettown Longwood Fire & Rescue

## LIEUTENANT

### GENERAL DEFINITION OF WORK

Performs responsible protective service work in fire suppression or specialized area of the fire department performs responsible administrative work; supervise fire personnel in any instance requiring fire department response, responsible administrative work in the development and administration of training programs in the fire department; does related work as required.

### TYPICAL TASKS

- Responds to alarms and assists in the suppression of fire including rescue, entry, ventilation, salvage work and first response emergency situations;
- Instruct subordinate fire personnel in work assignment and procedures;
- Supervises and participates in the work of extinguishing fire and the life safety, incident stabilization and property conservation of an incident;
- Direct the activities of fire personnel in the training in all phases of firefighting and rescue;
- Assists in conducting pre-incident planning;
- Instructs in training programs and skills; set up training classes;
- May be assigned to a special area or project as necessary;
- Assists in developing the training policies, goals and objectives of the department and identifies training needs, prepares and evaluates programs;
- Must be a member, in good standing, with the Grissettown - Longwood Fire & Rescue for a period of two (2) years to hold the office of Lieutenant.
- Must perform the duties of all supervisory personnel in their absence;
- Performs other firefighting and related emergency tasks;
- Performs related task as required;

### KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

Thorough knowledge of the command structure of the fire department; thorough knowledge of fire techniques and procedures as applied to fire suppression; general knowledge of fire prevention and pre-planning strategies and techniques; ability to reduce relatively complex ideas

into easily understood presentations; thorough knowledge of department rules and regulations and SOG'S; general knowledge of supervisory principles and practices; thorough knowledge of street system and physical layout of the fire district; NC certification in Hazardous Materials Awareness and Operations Level; thorough knowledge of the Incident Command System and accountability; principles and techniques of accident extrication, ability to understand and follow oral and written instructions; ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with fellow members and the general public; possession of mechanical aptitude; physical endurance and agility.

#### EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

Any combination of education and experience equivalent to graduation from high school, GED and extensive firefighting experience.

#### SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

Possess and maintain a valid appropriate driver's license issued by the State of North Carolina. Must meet and maintain minimum qualifications for position as established by the department.
